**PREFACE**

Environmental, climatic and social determinants of health are increasingly recognized as driving factors which shape the future of human and animal life on our planet. The growing threats are particularly evident in the ever growing urban areas where, among others, epidemic outbreaks, heat stress, burn out, violence and behavior related non-communicable diseases are demanding more and more public health actions.

Against this background, the hereby announced symposium on Planetary Health has the *overall aim* of strengthening the international research community working for a better future and of sharing with colleagues and students the current work being done in the context of Planetary Health. The occasion is threefold: To celebrate the 10<sup>th</sup> cohort of our Master in Global Urban Health at Freiburg University - the renaming of our University Centre into "Centre for Planetary Health" - the new status of our Centre as UN Habitat Collaborating Centre. All three have in common to address interrelated challenges for planetary health - particularly in urban areas- and to motivate the international health community to fight for a better and safer life on our planet.

*Specific objectives* are 1. To provide a platform for interested colleagues, alumni and students to interchange experiences learn from each other and establish a collaborative network. 2. To strengthen the awareness of planetary health issues particularly in urban areas with a focus on environmental, social and climatic determinants of health and 3. To explore research needs for changing the current trends in planetary health.

Our interdisciplinary symposium will highlight the diversity of current or future research efforts related to improving or maintaining the well-being of all, but particularly of vulnerable population groups by analyzing social, environmental, climatic and biological risk factors for health. Contributions will particularly, but not exclusively, relate to the challenges of urban living, the spread of communicable diseases and climate change. The list of speakers, coming from different academic backgrounds and having fought for years and even decades for improved health conditions particularly of disadvantaged population groups in the Global South shows the wide range of disciplines contributing to our theme and the state of the art: where we are and where we are going.
