Hajo Grundmann studied Nursing and Human Medicine and at the University of Freiburg, Germany. He specialised in Clinical Tropical Medicine, Medical Microbiology and Hygiene & Environmental Medicine and received his PhD (habilitation) at the University of Freiburg, Germany and an MSc in Epidemiology of Communicable Diseases at the London School of Hygiene. He worked clinically as a medical doctor at university hospitals in Freiburg, Berlin, Nottingham and Groningen and carried out extensive field studies in Taiwan, Venezuela and Tanzania. For eight years, he was the Project Leader of the European Antimicrobial Resistance Surveillance System (EARSS) funded by the European Commission and the Dutch Ministry of Health at the Dutch National Institute for Public Health and the Environment (RIVM). He holds an honorary Chair for Infectious Diseases Epidemiology at the University of Groningen and is now responsible for Infection Prevention and Hospital Epidemiology at the University Hospital Freiburg, Germany. His major research interests are the epidemiology, population dynamics and health impact of health care associated infections and emerging antimicrobial resistance. –
